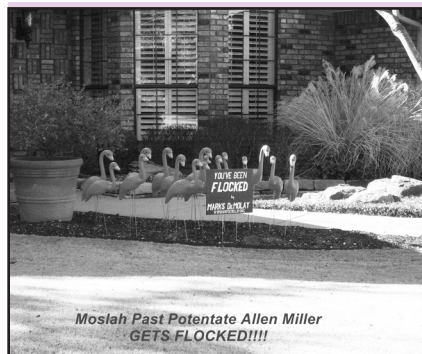

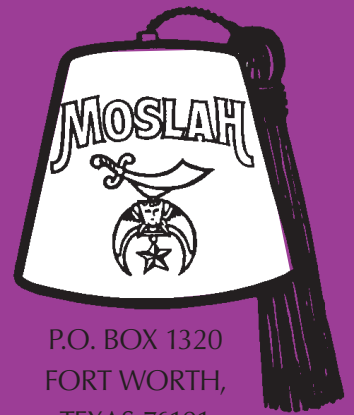
FLYING FEZ
