Firefighters Kayak 1,000-plus Miles for Shriners Hospitals

Four firefighters kayaked more than 1,000 miles – from Fort Lauderdale, Fla., to their hometown of Virginia Beach, Va. – to raise money for Shriners Hospitals for Children. They began their journey on May 19 and returned home to a crowd of 100 supporters, a fireboat and two fire engines welcoming their arrival on June 24.

Mark Hundley, Ray Irizarry, Paul Gleaton and Mark Sturgis, all of the Virginia Beach Fire Department, exceeded their \$20,000 fundraising goal and will donate the money to the four Shriners Hospitals providing burn care, located in Boston; Cincinnati; Galveston, Texas; and Sacramento, Calif. Fire Capt. April Elmore assisted with their campaign and helped spread the word through their Web site, www.teamvbfd.org.

The grueling journey up the Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway required a major time commitment and a lot of preparation. The men had to save up leave time and trade shifts with co-workers to be able to take off work for the trip. They endured a vigorous training schedule and spent thousands of dollars – from their own pockets – on equipment and food.

"We wanted people to be confident that 100 percent of their donations went to the children," explained Gleaton.

This is the second major donation made by Gleaton and Sturgis, who were part of a team that kayaked the waterway in 1998. They organized their recent trip as a 10-year reunion of the first adventure, which raised \$10,000 for Shriners Hospitals.

Gleaton, 47, a fire captain, admits he was wary about making the trip now that he is 10 years older. "It's easy to want to quit when you get tired, but I just think of those kids

in the hospital and how they have to keep going," he said. "They are the ultimate motivation."

Novice kayakers Hundley and Irizarry were eager to take on the challenge. They paddled 30 miles a day, often facing severe weather or high wakes from pleasure boats racing past. Despite the obstacles, they hope to do it again someday.

"It was a great time with a great group of guys," Hundley said. "It's all about who you're with and the people you meet along the way."

One of the most memorable experiences for the firefighters was a conversation with two fishermen while paddling through Georgia. After a brief chat, they discovered the fishermen were Shriners. When they learned about the purpose of the

kayakers' journey, the Shriners took money from their wallets and donated to the cause.

The four men also spent time with the Oriental Shrine Club in North Carolina, and were greeted by members of Khedive Shriners from Chesapeake, Va., upon their return. Several fire stations provided food and shelter along the way, and Spec Rescue International, a professional training and consulting organization, provided support drivers – people who follow the kayakers' route by vehicle and provide assistance and necessary supplies – throughout the journey.

Football's Finest Hour Returns to the Bayou City

Houston to Host College Football's Best at the 84th Annual East-West Shrine Game

Houston, TX – Football and philanthropy are at the center of the 84th Annual East-West Shrine Game, which is set for Jan. 17, 2009, in Houston, Texas, at the University of Houston's Robertson Stadium.

The football match-up, which began in 1925, features many of the best college players in the U.S. and Canada, divided by region but coming together to raise money for the children receiving care at the 22 Shriners Hospitals for Children across the North America.

This year's event features two storied head coaches, Bobby Ross and Gene Stallings, who will be leading the teams for bi-coastal bragging rights.

Gene Stallings brings 18 years of NFL experience to this year's game, as well as an impressive record as a college head coach. Bobby Ross also comes to the sidelines with an outstanding NFL and college football resume, including leading the San Diego Chargers to Super Bowl XXIX.

The coaches aren't the only big names associated with the East-West Shrine Game. A total of 62 Shrine Game alumni, from Dick Butkus to Joe Greene to Gale Sayers, are featured in the NFL Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio. And each year, the game adds football's future stars to its extensive roster.

"The East-West Shrine Game has always fielded college football's best and offered a great way for the talent of tomorrow to be showcased for the public, as well as NFL scouts," said Jack Hart, executive director of the East-West Shrine Game. "Last year's game featured 44 players who were chosen in the 2008 NFL draft. This is big-time football being coached by NFL pros, which, when combined with the wonderful cause of helping the kids in the Shriners Hospitals, makes this the most prestigious college all-star football game in America."

But, it's not just the list of players who have participated over the years that makes this game "Football's Finest Hour." The Shrine Game's true purpose - helping to support Shriners Hospital for Children - is what sets this event apart from all others.

Since 1925, the Shrine Game has been played to raise money and to increase public awareness of Shriners Hospitals for Children, an international health care system of 22 hospitals dedicated to providing pediatric specialty care, innovative research and outstanding teaching programs. Children up to age 18 with orthopaedic conditions, burns, spinal cord injuries, and cleft lip and palate are eligible for care and receive all services at no charge – regardless of financial need. More than 865,000 young patients have received state-of-the-art care at Shriners Hospitals. Two of those hospitals are in Houston and Galveston, Texas.

Ralph Semb, president and CEO of Shriners Hospitals for Children, said, "This game is Shriners' 'Window to the World.' It is our moment of time each year to present what we are all about on national television, giving us the opportunity to create an awareness that will allow us to care for more children. It is a great venue to promote our mission of providing specialty health care for children, and at the same time gives our members a chance to become involved and have fun."

As a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, Shriners Hospitals for Children relies on the generous donations of Shriners and the general public to carry out our mission and change the lives of children every day. To date, the East-West Shrine Game has raised millions of dollars for Shriners Hospitals and has helped inform millions of people about the mission of this extraordinary philanthropy.



After Ike

Crossing over the causeway to Galveston Island on Sunday, October 26, it is impossible to describe the devastation that Hurricane Ike imposed; boats and cars pushed to the side of the road, large oak and pine trees "burned" by the salt water and piles of rubbish just pushed to the side of the road to allow traffic. This all occurred on Saturday, September 13 when Ike – the worst storm to hit Galveston since 1900 – the Category 2 storm pushed ashore with a serge force equal to a Category 4 or 5.

Our Hospital (Shriners Hospitals for Children (SHC) – Galveston) started evacuation on Friday, the day before. Six patients were medi-vac'd to SHC-Cincinnati with 15 RNs and 2 Respiratory Therapists. Four children and their families were sent to the SHC-Shreveport and fifteen children, families and staff were bused to College Station where they were assigned exclusive use of the A&M Consolidated Middle School by the Disaster Coordinator. This was necessary due to the fact that SHC-Houston was also in the path of lke and evacuated its building.

As a result of the storm serge, our hospital suffered approximately 30 inches of water on the first floor of the main building. The new parent housing facility sustained enough water to necessitate removal of sheet rock and floor coverings and, being built on a pier and beam foundation, the insulation under the flooring was also filled with water. The skin bank, on the Harbor side of the University of Texas Medical Branch (UTMB) campus, sustained nearly 5 feet of water. The Galveston hospital is connected to the UTMB campus and John Sealy Hospital by a pedestrian bridge. UTMB has 100 buildings on the island with 1 million square feet on the first floors. Their buildings had from 6 inches to 6 feet of water. It is estimated that **UTMB** suffered up to \$700 million in damage because most major services were located on the first floor of their buildings.

The Galveston SHC suffered an estimated \$4.5 to \$5 million in "out of pocket" damages including building, equipment, supplies, research specimen's damages; and loss time for the employees. One of our tragic losses was \$450,000 in cadaver skin due to loss of power and dry ice not being able to maintain the necessary temperature controls.

On September 15, our staff returned home from Cincinnati to witness the dmages of their homes. The staff and children from College Station returned to Houston on September 16. A clinic was assembled at the SHC-Houston and the local patients

started treatment on September 30. Surgery will be scheduled to begin for burn patients in SHC-Houston on November 6 and 7. There are 30 to 40 Galveston employees who have temporary assignment at our Houston hospital. Also, there are 65 medical researchers who Dr. Herndon has placed at UTMB to continue their research projects.

The air quality in our main building was stabilized as of October 25. UTMB restored the chilled water and steam, which they provide to SHC, on October 24. The reconstruction should begin within the next few weeks for the damages on the first floor. The staff is scheduled to return to the building by November 7. The Fire Marshall has granted permission subject to and limited to daylight hours, Monday through Friday, with the staff closely following the Life Safety Plan submitted, which includes a full time staff member on each floor of the building, patrolling for fire watch. Full use of the building is subject to the fire protection equipment being replaced and operational. Communication equipment should be replaced by Thanksgiving.

Restoration efforts started within days of the storm. The sheetrock was removed in all of the buildings approximately 4 feet above the high water line. There was approximately 6 inches to a foot of silt in the buildings. The major damage which will control the return of patients includes the fire pumps, control panels for the fire alarms and fire, medical gas pumps, and the telephone switch. UTMB will resume a portion of its operations with 200 of the 500 beds with full support on November 10 including full restoration of the Blocker Adult Burn Unit and the Plastic surgery department. This will assure that the doctors which we share with the UTMB will be able to continue employment on the Island. The return of SHC children is still undetermined due to the unknown delivery dates of the damaged equipment. The patients will return while the first floor is being restored.

We should all be very proud of being a part of an organization that not only cares so much about its patients, but also its staff who left their families and homes behind to care for the patients to insure their safe transportation to the alternate hospitals. SHC has agreed to continue the payroll for all Galveston employees for the duration of this down time. The employees have pulled together to assist each other in cleaning up their damaged homes, including the formation of the "MOD" (Muscle On Demand) squad.

Our Hospital has approximately 315 full time employees, almost half of whom lived on the Island. Of those, 130 suffered losses, with 90 of these

employees suffering major losses, but had flood insurance. There were 40 employees who suffered major loss and had no insurance. There has been a special fund established in Tampa for the relief of these employees. This fund is a 501(c)(3) charity. Some of these families have lost everything they owned. 


