MOSLAH HONORS

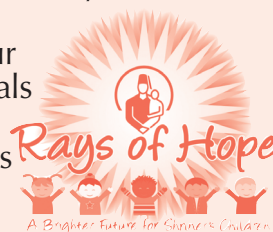

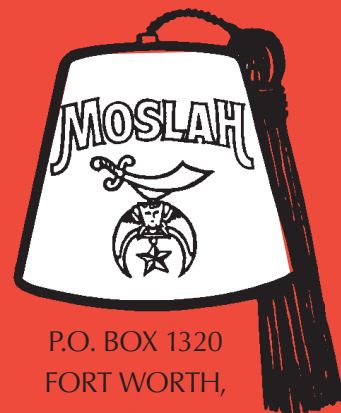
