

Moslah Shrine History

e covered the ground breaking ceremony in the last article and I have two comments to add to it. First, doesn't it seem unusual that the ceremony would occur while the Mosque was being built nearby? Also, the following quote was taken from Noble Ward Collier's History about the engraved shovel Noble Levy used in the ceremony. "...it now appears that perhaps Noble Levy kept the shovel in his care and custody until 1932. (Note: The writer is assured by Noble Robert Burns that the shovel is in the museum of the Masonic Temple, 1100 Henderson, Fort Worth, TX. – HWC)." The above quote was written 56 years after the destruction of the Mosque which would be about 1985. However, I can find no trace of the shovel. Perhaps one of you readers could help me locate it. If so, please let me know. Now, on with the construction.



This picture appeared in the March 21, 1921 issue of The Star Telegram along with a picture of the completed Mosque. It is currently the only picture I have of the Mosque construction in progress.

The following is a quote from Nobel Ward Collier's History of Moslah Temple Mosque. "The results were unbelievable. Four months and 19 days after the idea was first suggested, we find a huge building, no doubt not entirely completed, but done enough to handle a large crowd at a feed and a still larger crowd on the second floor at a dance. Remember, autos were by no means the chief method of transportation for the average family in those days. They didn't have bull dozers." (Note: The first bulldozer was built by Cummings and McLeod in 1923 in Morrowvill, Kansas. However, tractors were widely used for farming after 1910) "They didn't have butane gas driven engines, electric powered tools, backhoe diggers, front end loaders, pile drivers, steel scaffolds, power driven mortar mixers, spray guns, dump trucks, copying machines, computers, chem.-cans and hundreds of things we take for granted today. Road graders and gravel

wagons were pulled by mules and horses and the gravel was dug with picks and loaded with man powered shovels. I have talked with men who remember the Mosque and each have confirmed by thinking that it was a huge building, covering an area much larger than the present Masonic Temple at 1100 Henderson St. in downtown Fort Worth, so how in the world did they construct an edifice of that size in less than five months?"

The winding or shoreline road also needed to be constructed. In my opinion, it is more than probable that it was constructed by the City of Fort Worth since it was built on city property. Its construction was also a huge task and records seem to indicate it was completed in 1919 around the time that the Mosque became fully operational. It certainly might have helped that the man who proposed building the Mosque, Noble Bill Davis, was also the Mayor of Fort Worth.



I have no date for this picture which claims to be of the completed Mosque. My guess would be early 1919 at latest.


SHRINE LEGACY PROGRAM
