





Dear Fellow Nobles,

This amazing, unique health care system that has changed the lives of countless children and families, and has grown from one single hospital to a global presence, is our responsibility.

I want to again thank you for the opportunity to serve you, and our staff, patients and families as president and chairman of our philanthropy, Shriners Hospitals for Children. It is an honor and privilege, and something that we approach with hope, resolve, dedication and a deep sense of responsibility. Our goal is simple and clear – to do the best we can every day for every patient and





As members of Shriners International, we should be very proud of what we have established, and of what happens in our hospitals, each and every day. We have done far more than change the lives of 1.2 million children. We have changed the lives of entire families, giving them hope, knowledge and understanding. And actually, we really can't put a definitive number on how many people we have helped. In addition to caring for patients in our 22 locations, we conduct hundreds of outreach clinics, our medical staff shares its knowledge through countless seminars and conferences, and our researchers have made discoveries that have impacted treatment protocols worldwide.

We know that every year, thousands of children are born with or contract the conditions we treat. Earlier this year, detailed, specific information on implementing screening programs for potential patients, including policies and processes, was provided to temple potentates and recorders. Assisting with screening clinics is an excellent way for Shriners to be actively involved in their philanthropy and in helping reach more children and families. Also, whenever possible, we need to

be introducing ourselves, and our organizations, to school nurses, day care centers, and social service and assistance offices. I'm sure you can think of even more opportunities and possibilities.

Of course, we are also using every medium available to raise awareness of Shriners Hospitals for Children, which, indirectly, can also lead to increasing patient numbers. We are continuing our ad campaigns that feature patients sharing their enthusiasm and gratitude for Shriners Hospitals, and we have again been featured on a story line of the iconic television program *General Hospital*, and on *Who Wants to be a Millionaire* during their charity week event. Also, beginning in April, we will be running digital display ads on Medscape that will encourage physicians to visit our website, and hopefully that will also strengthen referrals. I hope that every time you see one of our ads or other media items, you are reminded of how special and important Shriners Hospitals for Children is, and are proud to belong to an organization that changes lives and gives families around the world hope for the future. One parent said it simply, and best: "You wrap us in hope – and hope is everything."



As we work toward increased awareness, we need to do more to promote the expertise and knowledge available at Shriners Hospitals. We need to do all we can to ensure that potential referring physicians, families, and even donors, know we offer the latest treatments, and that children who come to us will benefit from innovative and complete approaches to care. We need to be promoting the fact that we have expert physicians, clinicians and therapists who will do all they can to help a child. You can assist in this effort by distributing the available materials, including the copies of *Leaders in Care* (our corporate health care magazine) that your temple receives every quarter.




That commitment to excellence and to using the best, cutting-edge technology is why we are installing EOS imaging systems in many of our locations. The EOS system uses up to 89 percent less radiation than traditional X-rays, while generating high quality threedimensional views of patients' bone structures. The ability to obtain the images needed while reducing radiation exposure is especially important, as many of our patients will require many X-rays over the course of their care. The EOS Imaging System is the only 3-D system capable of scanning patients in a weight-bearing standing or sitting position, which enhances the ability to determine the best course of treatment.

Fifteen of our locations have been approved for EOS capabilities; our Canada, Greenville, Philadelphia, Portland and Salt Lake City locations have systems in place, and systems are in the process of installation at our Boston, Spokane and Twin Cities locations.

We are also committed to operating our health care system efficiently. That is why we are rebuilding both the Lexington and Los Angeles structures as medical centers focused

primarily on outpatient services, while working with community partners for needed inpatient care and other items.

On Dec. 1, 2015, the final steel beam was placed on the new Shriners Hospitals for Children Medical Center — Lexington. The new \$48 million building will be a state-of-the-art ambulatory care center located on the University of Kentucky's HealthCare campus. The new medical center will better meet the needs of our patients receiving orthopaedic care on an outpatient basis. Construction is expected to be completed in the spring of 2017. Imperial Sir Jeff Sowder is overseeing this project.



new \$77 million, 75,000-square-foot, three-story, state-of-the-art medical center, scheduled to open in the summer of 2017, will be located in Pasadena and will replace our aging Los Angeles Shriners Hospital. The new medical center will offer treatment for a full range of pediatric orthopaedic conditions, cleft lip and palate, reconstructive and plastic surgeries, and other services, with inpatient care provided at Huntington Memorial Hospital. The two hospitals will work together in a shared services partnership, which will greatly benefit the children in this region. Deputy Imperial Potentate Chris Smith is overseeing this project.

We are implementing a new telehealth effort. This program will reduce transportation costs for the temples and time away from home for patients and families, while increasing our ability to care for patients who live significant distances from our 22 locations. Our Salt Lake City and Philadelphia locations were selected as our tele-orthopaedic pilots, while Galveston was selected to pilot this program for our burn hospitals. Ultimately, this program also has the potential to increase our patient numbers, as we will be able to connect with more patients outside the reach of our hospitals.

Many other programs and initiatives are underway, including new technologies for orthotics and prosthetics and strengthening our ability to track and analyze outcomes. We are also working to fill vacant positions at the hospitals, and have recently filled three chief of staff and several staff physician positions.

While all of these efforts are important, what is most important is that everyone connected to Shriners Hospitals – every staff member, volunteer and noble - know they are valued and needed in order to fulfill the mission and vision of our philanthropy.

Thank you for your dedication and commitment to Shriners Hospitals for Children and Shriners International.


