Dear Fellow Nobles,

People look forward to spring for many reasons, especially the promise of warmer weather. For our temple leaders, their ladies and the Imperial officers, spring means seminar season. The Oriental Guide and Assistant Rabban Leadership Conferences, which were a great success, were among the meetings that took place recently. Several topics were covered during the three-day meetings, including membership, leadership, fundraising, and budgets and planning. There was also a strong emphasis on teamwork; working together at all levels throughout the fraternity is critical to our success. The seminars were well attended – 178 men and 117 ladies participated in the Oriental Guide Conference and 143 men and 103 ladies were present for the Assistant Rabban Leadership Conference.



These conferences are extremely important to the strength and successful functioning of our temples, and go a long way in preparing and educating temple leaders as they take on new and more involved positions. I would like to thank both those who attended and those who organized and led these important meetings, especially Imperial Sir Jim Smith, chairman of the Leadership Conference Committee, and Lady Alice Smith, who led the ladies' sessions, and their committee members for their commitment to these important events. Also, I would like to encourage every temple's leadership to be sure their temple is represented at these meetings in the future – it will make a huge difference in the success of your temple.



The Sports Seminar was also held recently – it's always a very inspiring event and a reminder of the importance of sports opportunities for both our organizations and our patients.

In March, the 2017 Shriners Hospitals for Children College Classic took place at Minute Maid Park, the home of the Astros, in Houston, Texas. This event was a collaborative effort between Shriners Hospitals for Children® and the Astros Foundation.

The College Classic is regarded as one of the top collegiate baseball tournaments in the nation and continues to draw fans, top-ranked programs and scouts from every major league organization each year.

The three-day tournament featured the University of Mississippi, Baylor University, Texas Tech University, Texas A&M University, Texas Christian University and Louisiana State University. The tournament was televised by the FOX Sports family of networks and streamed live on FOX Sports GO. Ultimately, TCU was named Tournament Champion, with a perfect 3-0 record.

The prestigious event brings out the media, and provides many opportunities for increasing awareness and generating interest in both Shriners International and Shriners Hospitals for Children. Events like this one can go a long way in helping us publicize and promote the missions and work of our organizations.

The attendance total of 53,565 broke the 17-year record as the best attended Shriners Hospitals for Children College Classic ever, and that is certainly something to be proud of and to celebrate.



We can also take pride in the level of commitment our medical and clinical staff have for responding to emergency situations when they arise. Recently, our executive team and medical staff worked together to send Rapid Response teams from our Galveston and Cincinnati hospitals to Guatemala to help in the aftermath of the recent fire at a youth home there. Our medical professionals helped several patients, and facilitated the transport of nine children to our burn hospitals for care. Difficult and disturbing as the situation in Guatemala is and has been, our teams demonstrated tremendous compassion, skill and teamwork during this effort and we commend every one of them.



In my last message, we discussed membership numbers and the successful efforts to lower the NPD numbers. We need to continue the momentum and work every day to recruit, retain and restore members. Start working now – and continue working on your temple's membership, especially contacting those who seem to be less active or involved. Don't wait until the end of the year to address these issues. An ongoing, continuous effort to communicate with and be aware of the concerns and needs of your nobles can go a long way to maintaining

your numbers. Also, sharing the story of Shriners International – and why it matters to you – at every opportunity, can only help with the creation of new nobles.


