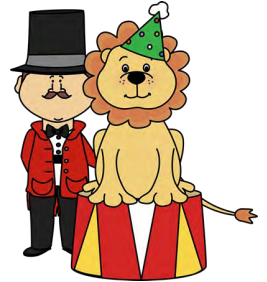

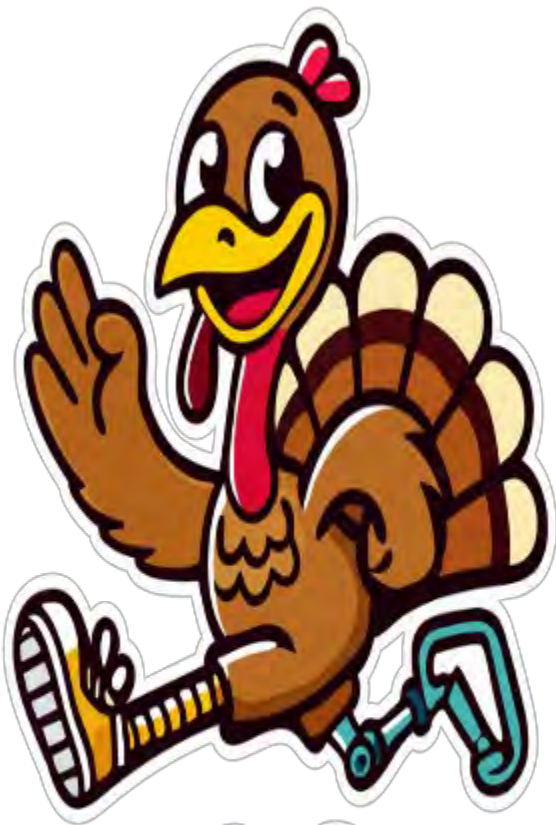

Fall is upon us, now what do we drink? How about a pumpkin beer? Pumpkin beers have a long and rich history in our country. During the settling of the new world in the 17th century, beer was brought over on their ships. Being boiled and fermented, beer was a necessity because it was safe to drink. The pioneers intended on sailing further south because they knew the weather would be better but ran out of beer and needed to restock so they were forced to cut the journey short and settle the new land further north. To make beer, you need sugar to ferment. Today, we use all sorts of stuff, but the early settlers had to use what they could find, and they found pumpkins. Pumpkin based beers continued to thrive in the new land until a reliable supply of grain could be obtained. Today's pumpkin beers are quite a bit different than they were back then. Today, you can find "pumpkin pie in a glass" which appeals to a wide market. They do this by adding pie spices to the mix. I, for one, love pumpkin beers. Some great commercially available beers to look for would be Post Road Pumpkin by Brooklyn Brewery who boast their recipe as "a delicious rendition of the traditional American classic" and Harvest Pumpkin Wheat by Blue Moon which will be more like the pie in the glass.

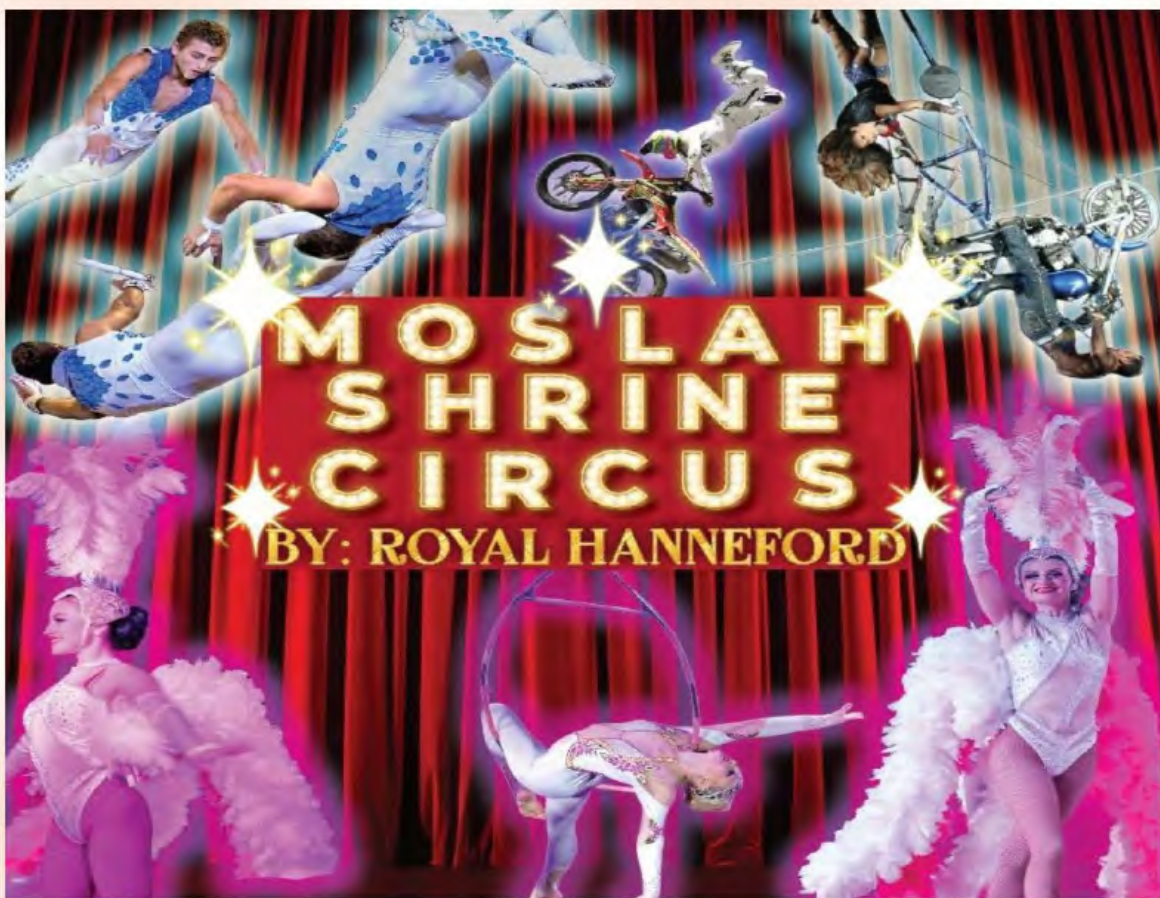

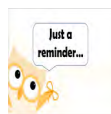
