DUES INFORMATION

Moslah Nobles,

Thank you for your continued dedication to Moslah Shriners and our shared mission of fellowship and philanthropy. Your commitment is what drives our fraternity forward and directly supports the life-changing care provided by Shriners Children's.

As we prepare for the 2027 renewal cycle, we are writing to provide a transparent breakdown of your upcoming annual dues.

At the 2026 Imperial Session, Representatives passed an automatic annual per capita increase that becomes effective immediately for 2027 temple year. The annual increase in the per capita tax is based on increases in the consumer price index and membership losses. Per Capita in 2027 is going up \$4.00 to \$54.00

2027 Moslah Dues Breakdown \$204.00

Imperial Per Capita Tax: \$54.00 (Set by Shriners International to support global fraternity operations). Previous rate was \$50.00

Hospital Assessment: \$5.00

Moslah Temple Dues \$145.00

2026-27 INTERNATIONAL PATIENT AMBASSADORS—COLTON & MACIE



Colton, 17, is a high school senior and multisport athlete with a competitor's heart. Told his prosthetic leg could limit his activities, Colton consistently proved otherwise.

When Colton's mom, Becky, was pregnant, the ultrasound showed that his legs were measuring different lengths and he had only four toes on

his left foot. But it wasn't until Colton was born that they learned he had fibular hemimelia – the absence of the smaller of the two bones in the lower leg – along with a shorter leg, bowed tibia, malformed ankle and missing toe.

His grandfather's cousin, a Shriner, knew of Shriners Children's expertise in orthopedic conditions and advised the family to seek care at Shriners Children's St. Louis.

"We walked through those hospital doors and you could literally feel the warmth, the love and the caring before we even talked to anybody," Becky said.

At Shriners Children's St. Louis, orthopedic surgeon Perry Schoenecker, M.D., outlined two possible treatment paths. One involved a series of limb-lengthening surgeries beginning around age 8 or 9, together with ankle reconstruction – a long process that can take 5 to 10 years. The other was amputation at the ankle and then fitting the baby for a prosthesis.

The family chose amputation and they have never regretted that decision. Colton had his first surgery when he was 1 and received his first prosthesis shortly after that. He is currently on his tenth prosthetic. While his prosthetic makes him different from friends and classmates, Colton knows it also provides him opportunities. He is able to show that with diligence and a dream, anything is possible, no matter the hurdles. "I'm sticking out for a reason," he said.

An accomplished student-athlete, Colton has competed in wrestling, baseball, basketball and track and currently participates in football and golf for his high school. He plays both offensive and defensive line for his high school football team and played in two high school state golf tournaments. Colton has been a Patient Ambassador at the Kansas Shrine Bowl many times, even serving as a manager for the West team since 2024. His goal is to return to the field – this time as a player in 2027. Colton lives in a small Kansas town surrounded by miles of wide open wheat fields. He loves the freedom of rural life, where everything he needs – school, the coffee shop, the golf course, the football field – is close and familiar.

Whether raising and showing pigs as part of his youth agricultural project or tackling daily farm work alongside his grandpa, uncle and cousin, Colton is always up for the task.

Colton speaks about Shriners Children's with deep affection and loyalty and is grateful for the opportunity to help others as he was helped.

Macie, 15, is a high school sophomore and a talented softball pitcher from Tampa, Florida.

She has played the sport since she was 7 and has long dreamed she'd play her way onto a college team. Softball isn't just an activity for her – it's her passion and greatest joy.

So, when Macie, then 10, was diagnosed with idiopathic scoliosis, a curvature of the spine, she was worried. "When I first learned I had scoliosis, I was scared I wouldn't be able to play softball, or any sport, anymore," she said.

Doctors prescribed a nighttime brace, and Macie wore it faithfully, hoping it would keep her curve from progressing.

Despite being diligent about wearing her brace, Macie's curve worsened. A doctor recommended a surgical procedure that would limit her spinal mobility, making pitching difficult, if not impossible. But Macie and her mother had reservations.

Macie's mother, Michelle, a pediatric nurse, began searching for alternatives. That led her to Shriners Children's Philadelphia and spine surgeon Amer Samdani, M.D., who is a pioneer of vertebral body tethering (VBT). VBT uses a flexible, belt-like tether attached to individual vertebrae. As the child grows, the tether guides the spine into a straighter position – without sacrificing flexibility. The procedure is only possible for children who are still growing, and Macie was an ideal candidate.

In October 2023, Macie and her mother drove 17 hours from their home in Tampa to Philadelphia for the surgery.

Just two months later, she was back on the mound.

"My coach started me in our first tournament of the season," she said. "I threw that first pitch and I knew this had worked. I think I struck out the first batter."

A year after surgery, a follow-up X-ray confirmed the transformation.

"It was a completely different picture," Macie said. "It showed me that my spine had completely changed – and that I'd never have to deal with this again."

In 2025, Macie was invited to throw out a ceremonial first pitch at the Shriners Children's Clearwater Invitational. She even got to meet the University of Alabama softball team. It was a dream moment for the young athlete.

As a Shriners Children's International Patient Ambassador, Macie speaks with genuine gratitude about her experience.

"I want to give back as an International Patient Ambassador because I don't think anything could ever repay Shriners Children's for what they did for me," she said.

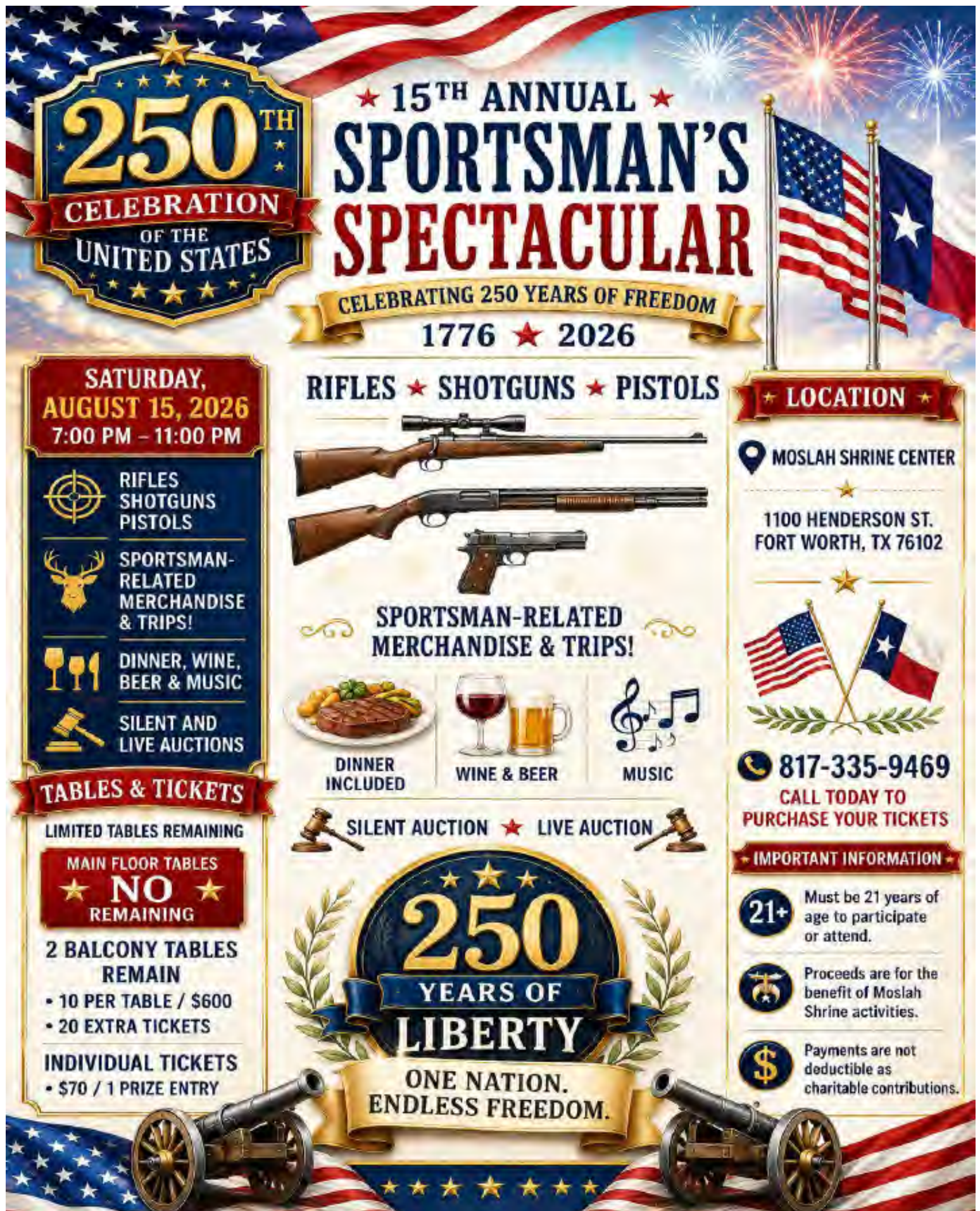

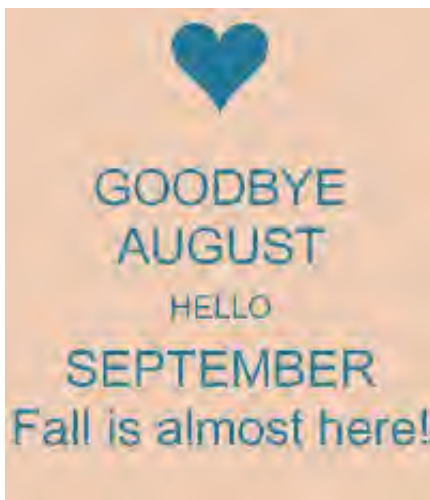
